Resolution Authorizing A Contract With The County Of Somerset To Provide Participation In A Cooperative Means Of Conducting Certain Community Development Block Grant And Home Investment Partnership Program Activities

WHEREAS, Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 provides for substantial federal funds being made available to certain urban counties for use therein; and

WHEREAS, the Community Development Block Grant Program and the HOME Investment Partnership Programs have benefited the County as a whole and has provided a unique opportunity for inter-municipal cooperation and

WHEREAS, the program has provides substantial benefits to persons of low and moderate income including the elderly and disabled, and that these benefits would be lost without a renewal of the County cooperation agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Manville desires to preserve benefits of the Community Development Block Grant Program and the HOME Investment Partnership Programs for the County by renewing its participation in the Somerset County Community Development Consortium; and

WHEREAS, the Interlocal Services Act (N.J.S.A. 40:8A-1 et seq.) provides a mechanism through which counties and municipalities may enter into agreements for the provision of joint services; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40:8A-1 et seq. provides that authorization for participation in such a cooperative program must be by resolution:

1. It does hereby authorize continued participation in the Somerset County Community Development Consortium or Urban County.
2. It does hereby authorize, ratify and confirm a certain agreement (hereinafter referred to as "Contract") between the Borough of Manville and Somerset County entitled "Agreement Between the County of Somerset and Certain Municipalities Located Therein For the Establishment of Cooperative Means of Conducting Certain Community Development Activities" and is further authorized to amend language that is contained in the existing agreement to comply with new requirements from the Department of Housing and Urban Development. This agreement shall automatically renew in every successive qualification period unless notice that it wishes to withdraw is provided to HUD and Somerset County.
3. It hereby authorizes full participation by the Borough of Manville in all aspects of the activities provided for within said Contract pursuant to the terms and conditions as more fully set forth in said Contract.
4. It hereby incorporates said Agreement into this Resolution by reference, as if fully set forth herein.
5. The Mayor and Municipal Clerk are hereby authorized to execute the Contract with the County and Copy of said Contract will remain filed in the Office of the Municipal Clerk for public inspection.

COMMITTEE REPORTS AND COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilman Petrone, as Chairperson of the Building and Grounds Committee stated there has been progress made on the Kiddie Pool at Memorial Park. Recreation Director Cefalone has scheduled a meeting to discuss celebration activities for the Borough's 90th Anniversary on July 25th. The seniors held their annual summer picnic at Colonial Park and Bill Crosby from the Office of Volunteer Services spoke about the Somerset County Handyman Program. Library Director Nan Peterson met with Bob Barringer from Cornerstone Architectural Group and Chris from the Somerset County Library Association regarding the grant application program currently being offered by the State.

Councilman Szabo as Chairperson the Progress and Development Committee stated the Redevelopment Attorney will be reaching out to the representatives from the Rustic Mall to set up a meeting.

Councilman Skirkanish as Chairperson of Finance Committee stated the Committee met on July 8th and in attendance was Councilman Lukac, Councilman Szabo, and CFO Pitts. There was a negative cash flow in June and will also be one in July as there are no taxes being collected. Estimated tax bills will not be sent. There will be a positive cash flow in August and would like to thank the Board of Education for allowing the Borough to make two payments. Councilman Skirkanish stated the tax bills are estimated to be close to this year. The Board of Health will be meeting tomorrow July 16th at 5:30 pm.

Councilwoman Zamorski as Chairperson of the Public Safety Committee stated the Committee hasn't met yet. She reported there were 19 fire calls for the month of June, 12 so far for July and a year to date total of 127.

Mayor Onderko said to Police Captain Herbst that he would like to set up a meeting to discuss a traffic intensified action program.

Councilman Lukac as Chairperson of the Department of Public Works Committee stated the DPW crews continue to perform grass cutting at all Borough owned properties, maintain the sports fields and parks as needed, milling and patching of potholes and perform daily checks on the pools. Due to Emerald Ash infestation 15 trees around the high school needed to be removed. NJ American Water and PSE& G continue projects throughout the Borough.

Council President Magnani, as Chairperson of Policy, Planning, and Personnel Committee stated the Committee met and discussed the Clerk and Administrator's position. There were two interviews for the Clerk position held and the Administrator interviews will be next week. She stated the Borough is sponsoring a Food Drive for FoodStock 2019 and encourage the public to donate. She attended a Freeholder sponsored concert event in Dukes Park and encouraged the Public to attend one of the events held.

Mayor Onderko stated the tax rate from the County has not yet been struck and are waiting on certifications on budgets for Somerset County via the State. The tax bills will be delayed till the end of August or early September. He attended a water rescue training exercise conducted by the Fire Dept, EMS, and Police Dept. Mayor Onderko stated he is remaining optimistic on the opening of the Kiddie Pool. He would like the Council to go on a tour of the Somerset Valley Sewerage Authority. Mayor Onderko invited the Public to National Night Out on August 6th.
