

Housing resources and services that are available to Somerset County residents affected by Hurricane Ida

Were you or someone you know affected by Hurricane Ida? The following is a list of housing resources and services that are available to Somerset County residents that were affected.

FEMA- individuals and business owners who sustained damage losses can begin applying for assistance by registering online at www.disasterassistance.gov or by calling 800-621-FEMA (3362). If you are a homeowner, you must file a claim with your insurance company first. Be sure to keep receipts and take photos of your damaged home and belongings; make a list of damaged or lost items.
