Snow Plowing Operation & Emergency Plan

To properly snow plow streets from curb to curb, residents are asked to remove all vehicles from the street. On designated Emergency Streets, residents are required to remove all vehicles as soon as the snow begins to fall. Failure to remove a vehicle from an Emergency Street will result in a traffic summons and vehicle being towed in Accordance with Borough Ordinance #500. Please check the Police Departments website for designated Emergency Streets.

**Snow Emergency Plan
Depending on the Nature of the Storm**

- * Roads are pre-treated as soon as snow begins to accumulate.
 - * Plowing operation does not start until an accumulation of 2-3 inches.
 - * Emergency streets and main arteries are done first.
 - * During the storm, one to two passes are performed on each street.
 - * Only when the storm is over are the streets plowed curb to curb.
 - * Snow plowing guidelines are dependent upon the nature of the storm.
- When curbing the streets, it is unfortunate that snow gets piled up in the end of already cleared driveways. This is unavoidable and it is suggested to residents that cleaning the end of a driveway be done after streets are fully curbed.
- In accordance with Ordinance #2017-1181, residents are to refrain from putting snow into the streets. This is not permissible and creates a safety hazard. In addition, property owners are required to clear their sidewalks of snow, ice or sleet 12 hours after the storm event has ended.

STREET SWEEPING

The street sweeping operation begins mid-April and ends mid-December, weather permitting, and will be performed periodically each month.



Street Light Outage
Is there a street light out on your street?

If you're a PSE&G electric customer, you can report a street light outage through the PSE&G My Account Log In or call PSE&G at 1-800-436-7734. Prior to contacting PSE&G, please obtain the pole number (located on a metal plate on the pole), the street name, nearest cross street, and "in front of address" to help locate and complete the repair.

The Department of Public Works will also assist with any of your street light outages and concerns.

THINGS TO REMEMBER FOR THE YEAR 2022

January

- * Live Christmas trees will be picked up periodically during the month of January thru mid-February. Please remove all ornaments, lights, and tinsel before placing the tree on the curbside.

February

- * Just a reminder that taxes are due February 1st. The grace period ends February 10th. The interest for your taxes will begin on February 11th.

May

- * Just a reminder that there will be no pick up of garbage on Monday, May 30th. pick up for garbage will be on Tuesday, May 31st.
- * Just a reminder that taxes are due May 1st. The grace period ends May 10th. The interest for your taxes will begin on May 11th.

June

- * Manville Public Pools will open in June and pool badges can be purchased from the Recreation Department.

August

- * Just a reminder that taxes are due August 1st. The grace period ends August 10th. The interest for your taxes will begin on August 11th.

October

- * Just a reminder that Fall is quickly approaching and this year residents will be required to use the environmentally friendly process of bagging their own leaves. The service will be completed in each section of town at least once a week depending on volume and weather conditions.



November

- * Just a reminder that taxes are due November 1st. The grace period ends November 10th. The interest for your taxes will begin on November 11th.

Yard Waste

Yard waste will be collected curbside for the entire Borough on the scheduled days.

Yard waste consisting of branches, twigs, leaves, or plant materials ONLY can be placed curbside for pick -up on the scheduled collection day.

Branches & Brush Items

Branches cut to four (4) feet in length and tied with twine (no wire or tape) and placed neatly on curbside. Please do not block sidewalks. Debris from private contractor tree take downs/trimming will NOT be accepted.

Plant Materials or Garden Debris

Weeds, leaves, or small brush clippings should be placed in biodegradable paper bags or in open barrels or cans, weighing no more than 35 pounds per can or bag. Loose yard waste will not be picked up and plastic bags are not acceptable.

Grass clippings are NOT collected curbside.

Residents who wish to dispose of grass clippings can bring them to the Department of Public Works' yard on Saturdays from 8 a.m. to noon starting April 23rd through October 29th; excluding holidays May 30th and September 5th. **No plastic bags.**

As an alternative to disposing of grass clippings and yard waste, consider grass cycling or backyard composting.

A Truth about Grasscycling and Backyard Composting: Composting will improve soil moisture, decrease erosion and recycle nutrients and organic matter FREELY back to the soil. Grasscycling does not cause thatch build-up or spread lawn disease but increases organic matter for a healthier soil and lawn

- *Consumer electronics computers, printers, peripherals, telephones, cell phones, TVs, microwaves.
- *Hazardous waste such as, (but not limited to) motor oil, anti-freeze, propane tanks, fluorescent tubes, oil based paint, or chemicals.
- *Masonry items including concrete, bricks, block, stones, or dirt.
- *Textiles are no longer accepted at 1st Saturday drop off.
- *Medical Waste - contact local hospital for information on "Safe Syringe Program."

*RX disposal is done by the Sheriff's office.

*Recyclable items - newspaper, plastic/glass bottles, chipboard, cardboard, textiles, etc.

*Renovation/remodeling debris lumber, tile, siding, roofing materials. To check where an item goes, sign up for [Recycle Coach](#) and use the "What Goes Where Feature?" Call [New Jersey's Clean Energy Program](#) to arrange for a FREE pickup through New Jersey's Clean Energy Program and they will pay you \$50 for your old refrigerator (877-270-3520).

SANITARY SEWER COLLECTION SYSTEM INFORMATION

Should a sewer problem be experienced, the resident should first contact the Department of Public Works office. A sewer department representative will be dispatched to check the main sewer line.

The lateral sewer line and the location of the connection from the building to the main sewer is the property owner's responsibility, although we will assist with all available information and records. This information will be useful to you if you need to contact a plumber.

If an outside clean-out is present, we can inspect it and determine if the stoppage is on the service side of the cleanout. An attempt will be made to clear the obstruction if it is on the service side of the system. If there is no outside clean-out, the property owner is responsible for the service line from the building to the main sewer line.

Maintenance

To maintain your sewer line and avoid blockages, certain materials should not be flushed or dropped/inserted into the line, such as baby diapers, toys, personal hygiene products, construction debris, etc.

Prohibited

The discharge of stormwater, surface water, ground water and/or subsurface drains (sump pumps) is not permitted into the sanitary sewer system. The Borough of Manville will perform no work on private property except within the public utility easement.

STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

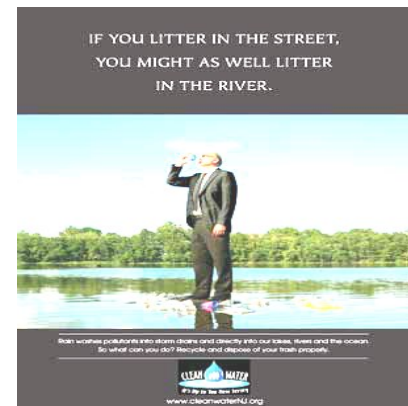
The Department of Public Works is responsible for and maintains the stormwater catch basin system and the sanitary sewer collection system. These are two separate infrastructures. The Stormwater catch basin System collects rainwater and directs it to the waterways through catch basins and outfalls. The sanitary sewer collection system, which consists of two pump stations, manholes, and sewer lines, transfers sewer waste water to the treatment plant. The Borough's stormwater catch basins are identified with markers. Remember, if it goes down there, it will end up in our streams, lakes, and rivers affecting our wildlife and drinking water.

Stormwater pollution is one of New Jersey's greatest threats to clean and plentiful water. In an attempt to reduce the amount of pollutants that enter our water system annually, the Borough of Manville has adopted several ordinances to prevent and control storm water pollution.

Fall has Arrived & It's Leaf Season



The Department of Public Works Provides Two Means of Leaf Collection



- * Bagged leaves can be put in biodegradable paper bags or containers and placed curbside for collection on the scheduled yard waste days or special bagged leaf days. Plastic bags cannot be accepted.
- * Leaf Vacuuming should begin mid to late October and the start of this service is based on the amount of fallen leaves. Residents can place leaves loose curbside once this service begins; however, leaves must be kept at least ten feet away from any storm water catch basin. Loose leaves must be free of any other yard waste (garden debris, branches, etc.). These type items should be bundled or bagged for the scheduled yard waste days.
- * Should you have a small amount of leaves, please place them in a container or biodegradable bag for pick-up on yard waste day.
- * The service of leaf vacuuming is done in each section of town at least once per week and is dependent on volume and will continue to about mid-December, weather permitting. If the weather becomes inclement, please contact Department of Public Works for the status of the leaf pick-up service.
- * Be safety-wise and never park a vehicle close to or on top of leaf piles.

NOTICE TO ALL PROPERTY OWNERS OF THE BOROUGH OF MANVILLE --- REGARDING FLOOD PROTECTION INFORMATION

Manville has the distinction of being the location where the Raritan River (which passes to the north) and the tributary Millstone River (which passes to the east) join together, in the far northeastern corner of the borough. Severe flooding occurs in Manville when these rivers overflow their banks into the northern section (Raritan) and the Lost Valley section (Millstone). The Lost Valley section in eastern Manville is situated on the natural flood plain between the Raritan and Millstone Rivers, and bears the brunt of occasional flooding events which affect the river basins. The southern parts of Main Street also suffer from flooding, due to the presence of a stream that backs up with water from the nearby Millstone River in which it empties, known as the Royce Brook. Floodplains from each of these rivers can combine and isolate a central portion of the Borough of Manville, if flooding conditions become severe enough. Even though your property may not have been flooded recently, living in community that is over 35-percent 100-year floodplain by area means the risk of damage due to flooding is always present and you should take precautions. Someday, flood levels could affect your property and you should be prepared.

FLOOD INSURANCE RATE MAP ZONE DETERMINATIONS AND BOROUGH FLOOD SERVICES

As a public service, the Borough of Manville Building Department will provide you with the following information upon request:

- Whether your property is in a special flood hazard area as shown on the current flood insurance rate map (FIRM) on file.
- Additional flood insurance data for a site, such as the specific flood zone and the base flood elevation depth if shown on the FIRM.
- The Borough has a handout on flood insurance purchase requirements that can help people who may need a mortgage or loan for a property in the special flood hazard area. If you would like to make an inquiry, please note your street address and the lot and block of your property. Additionally materials concerning flooding are contained in the Manville Library.
- The Borough Construction Official, John Tamburini, can be contacted by calling 908-725-9478 ext. 117 Monday through Friday. Mr. Tamburini is available by appointment.

FLOOD INSURANCE

Approximately 12 percent of the buildings located in the Borough are located in a flood hazard area as mapped by the Federal Emergency Management Agency. Flood insurance is available for said properties. If you do not have flood insurance, contact your insurance agent regarding the same. A standard homeowner's insurance policy will not cover certain damage from flooding. However, the Borough participates in the National Flood Insurance Program which allows homeowners to purchase a separate flood insurance policy. This insurance is backed by the Federal Insurance program and is available to everyone, even to property owners who have previously been flooded. Some people have purchased flood insurance because it was required by a bank or mortgage company. There is a 26% chance of a possible flood during the life of a 30 year mortgage. Usually such policies only cover the building structure and not the contents. During flooding which occurs in the Borough, contents of a property can also be damaged. If you currently have flood insurance, you should make sure that contents are also covered. Flood insurance is also available to renters for personal property within a structure. There can be a 30 day waiting period before flood insurance coverage goes into effect. You should plan accordingly.

FLOOD SAFETY

All residents should remember the following in the event of a flood:

- Do not walk through flowing water during a flood. A mere 6 inches of fast moving flood water can knock over an adult. Currents can be deceptive and move faster than anticipated.
- Do not drive through flooded areas. Flood water can lead to vehicle damage, personal injury and even death in severe instances. It takes just 12 inches of rushing water to carry away a small car, while two feet can carry away almost any automobile. Turn around, don't drown.
- Stay away from power lines and electrical wires. The number two killer regarding floods is electrocution. Electrical current can travel through water. Call 9-1-1 immediately to report a fallen or otherwise unsafe power line. If power lines are touching your car, do NOT get out unless your life is in immediate danger.
- Have your utilities turned off. If you know a flood is coming, you should shut off the gas and electricity and move valuable contents upstairs. This includes any such contents which are currently in a garage which also may be subject to flooding. It is wise to keep a detailed check list of things to do which would easily be available during and prior to emergency weather conditions. Some appliances such as television sets, keep electrical charges even after they have been unplugged. Don't use appliances or motors that have gotten wet unless they have been dried and certified as usable. You should also be alert for gas leaks. Use a flashlight to inspect for damage immediately after a flood. Don't smoke or use candles or other open flame unless you know the gas has been turned off in the area in question and said area is vented properly.
- During severe flood events, City Officials may decide that evacuation is necessary. Please follow all advisories and warnings in case of evacuation.

FLOOD MITIGATION

There are several different ways to protect a building from flood damage. One way is to keep water away by regarding your lot or building with a small flood wall or earthen berm. Another approach is to make your walls waterproof and place water tight closures over the doorways. This method is not recommended for houses with basements or if water levels will be over two (2) feet deep. A third approach is to raise the house above flood levels. A small wood frame house can usually be elevated above flood levels for approximately \$25,000.00. Many of the houses subjected to flooding in the golf course area have been raised in this manner. The above measures are referred to as flood proofing or retro-fitting. There are also steps which can be taken to protect against high wind velocity such as installing strong shutters and reinforced garage doors. Financial assistance may be available for certain flood mitigation activities. More information is available at the Manville Public Library. Important Note: Most alterations to your building or land require a permit from the Building Department.. Please check with the Construction Official prior to implementing any of the above procedures to determine what permits may be necessary. Additionally, qualified/certified staff members will provide advice and assistance on how to retrofit or modify a building to protect it from flood damage. Please contact John Tamburini, the Borough's Construction Official for information at 908-725-9478 ext. 117.

WHAT YOU CAN DO TO HELP

The Borough always appreciates cooperation and assistance from property owners. Here are some of the ways in which you can help in Manville's efforts to reduce damage due to flooding.

- Do not dump or throw any solid articles into the catch basins, drainage ditches, or streams located throughout the Borough. Throwing solid debris into these features prevents them from operating at peak levels during times of flooding. If you see anyone throwing solid materials into these features within the Borough, please contact the Department of Public Works at 908-725-5512. Borough Ordinance No. 2006 - 1031 E(2)i2 prohibits the dumping of debris in these features. The Ordinance is strictly enforced.

- Before any building is constructed within the Borough, a building permit is necessary. Always check with the Building Department before you build on, regrade, fill or otherwise have construction activity on your property. A permit may be needed to insure that the project(s) do not cause problems on other properties. If you see any activity being conducted without a permit, you may contact the Construction Official's office at 908-725-9478 ext. 117. A permit will be necessary if substantial improvements are made. The National Flood Insurance Program requires that if the cost of reconstruction, rehabilitation, addition or other improvements to a building equals or exceeds 50% of the building's market value, then the building must meet the same construction requirements as a new building. Substantially damaged buildings must also be brought up to the same standards and must be elevated above base flood elevation.

- In the event of a flood, flood warnings in most instances, will be given by the Emergency Alert System. Please make sure that your television or radio is tuned to a channel carrying the Emergency Alert System well in advance of any anticipated flood event. The Borough has a siren warning system in place that will sound the warning throughout the Borough if flooding is imminent. In addition, AM Station 1690 has been designated as the emergency station that will be activated during emergencies and can be accessed online or by tuning an AM radio to 1690.

NATURAL AND BENEFICIAL FUNCTIONS OF LOCAL FLOOD PLAINS

The Borough has unique and naturally beneficial local floodplains along Dukes Brook, the Raritan River, Royce Brook and the Millstone River. These provide a natural buffer against flooding and must be protected. Please respect these natural areas and help keep them in their natural state. Don't litter upon or destroy these areas.

BOROUGH FLOOD WARNING SYSTEM

Manville's Office of Emergency Management (OEM) is responsible for the Borough's Emergency Operations Plan. The plan outlines how the Borough of Manville will function during emergency or disaster conditions. The office regularly conducts preparedness drills and tests the flood warning sirens the first Saturday of each month, assists organizations with their emergency plans and seeks to educate the public about the value of emergency preparedness. OEM maintains and posts evacuation and flood hazard depth maps online <http://www.manvillenj.org> (select Borough Services >Public Safety>Flood Information). The Raritan and Millstone River gauges may be monitored at water.weather.gov.

ABOUT THE MANDATORY PURCHASE OF FLOOD INSURANCE IN THE BOROUGH OF MANVILLE

The NFIP: The National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) is a federal program enabling property owners in participating communities to purchase flood insurance on eligible buildings and contents, whether they are in or out of a floodplain. This community participates in the NFIP, making federally backed flood insurance available to its property owners.

The NFIP insures most walled and roofed buildings that are principally above ground on a permanent foundation, including mobile homes, and buildings in the course of construction. Property owners can purchase building and content coverage from any local property and casualty insurance agent. To find a local insurance agent that writes flood insurance in your area visit www.floodsmart.gov.

Mandatory Purchase Requirement: Pursuant to the Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973 and the National Flood Insurance Act of 1994, the purchase of flood insurance is mandatory for all federal or federally related financial assistance for the acquisition and/or construction of buildings in Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHAs). A SFHA is defined as any A or V flood zone on a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM)

The mandatory purchase requirement also applies to secured loans from such financial institutions as commercial lenders, savings and loan associations, savings banks, and credit unions that are regulated, supervised, or insured by federal agencies such as the Federal Reserve, the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, the Comptroller of Currency, the Farm Credit Administration, the Office of Thrift Supervision, and the National Credit Union Administration. It further applies to all loans purchased by Fannie Mae or Freddie Mac in the secondary mortgage market. Federal financial assistance programs affected by the laws include loans and grants from agencies such as the Department of Veterans Affairs, Farmers Home Administration, the Federal Housing Administration, Small Business Administration, and FEMA disaster assistance.

How it Works: When making, increasing, renewing, or extending any type of federally backed loan, lenders are required to conduct a flood zone determination using the most current FEMA FIRM to determine if any part of the building is located in an SFHA. If the building is in an SFHA, the federal agency or lender is required by law to provide written notification to the borrower that flood insurance is mandatory as a condition of the loan. Even though a portion of real property on which a building is located may lie within an SFHA, the purchase and notification requirements do not apply unless the building itself, or some part of the building, is in the SFHA. However, lenders, on their own initiative, may require the purchase of flood insurance even if a building is located outside an SFHA. Up to 25% of all NFIP flood losses arise from outside SFHAs (B, C, and X Zones). Under federal regulations, the required coverage must equal the amount of the loan (excluding appraised value of the land) or the maximum amount of insurance available from the NFIP, whichever is less. The maximum amount of coverage available for a single-family residence is \$250,000 and for non-residential (commercial) buildings is \$500,000. Federal agencies and regulators, including government-sponsored enterprises, such as Freddie Mac and Fannie Mae, may have stricter requirements.

Animal Control



- Report all animal bites immediately to the Health Department.
- An Animal Control Officer is available to respond to all animal emergencies: The Somerset Regional Animal Shelter is open to the public 7 days a week from 11AM-4PM and from 11AM-7PM on Wednesdays. They are located at 100 Commons Way, Bridgewater, NJ and can be reached at 908-725-0308. For after hour emergencies, call the Manville Police Department at 908-725-1900.
- All dogs and cats seven months or older must be licensed. New Jersey law requires proof of rabies vaccination for a license to be issued. Dog and cat licenses can be obtained at each Borough Hall, or through the mail.

Consumer Health Services

- Adult Health Screening is held annually and offers low cost blood tests; free screenings that may include blood pressure, hearing, vision, podiatric and chiropractic screening, colorectal health kits, body mass index (BMI) / percent body fat analysis, and health education.
- Free screening for breast, cervical, colorectal and prostate cancer is available for uninsured residents who meet financial criteria through the New Jersey Cancer Education and Early Detection (NJCEED) Program - call 908-526-2335.
- Quarterly cholesterol (total blood cholesterol) and blood pressure screening.

Environmental Services

- The Health Department conducts investigations of public health nuisances in residential and commercial areas to identify potential problems, and in response to citizen complaints regarding animals, insects and rodents, air and water pollution, and garbage or debris (solid waste).
- Retail food inspections are conducted throughout the year to assure that food retailers meet the State Sanitary Code.
- Investigation of utility (water, gas, and/or electric) shut-offs including referrals and safety information.
- When indicated, the Health Department tests for lead paint and provides abatement information.
- Institutional Inspections (daycare centers, nursing homes, hospitals) and public bathing places are routinely made for safety standards and cleanliness.

Safety, sanitation and heating of rented single or multiple dwellings are monitored in cooperation with local building, housing and safety code officials. Homeowners who remove or abandon a fuel (oil) tank must contact the Health Department.
