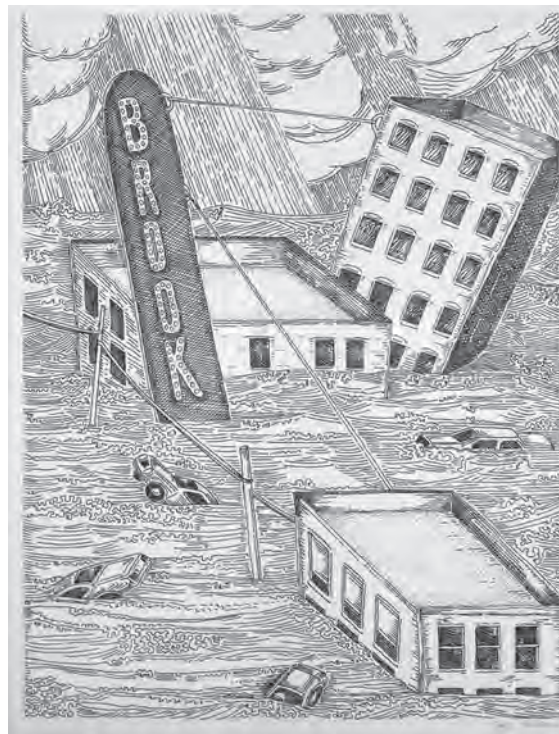

Mayor Onderko's Corner

As we head into summer, I feel it is a good time to give a brief update on some of the on-going projects in town. First, the Main Street road diet to benefit pedestrian safety will go out to bid this fall with construction beginning in the spring of 2023. Currently, NJ American Water is doing a water main replacement project along the entire roadway.

For the first round of Ida disaster aid, the Borough has been recently notified of being awarded \$10 million in FEMA aid as part of FEMA's new "Swift Current" program. That is the Borough's share of the total 60 million dollar "Swift Current" allocation for multiple states impacted by Hurricane Ida. The Borough will continue to seek additional funding

to help our residents move out of harm's way.

These initial funds can only be used for buyouts. There will be additional sources of money and a possible elevation program announced later this summer by the Governor's office. Funding for this program

was made possible by the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA). Residents will be notified soon of their eligibility for this program.

Our library will be receiving 2 grants to improve the main desk area in the interior of the building and new sidewalks around the block. A third grant was just completed with the installation of a power generator to power the entire building.

The new Lost Valley Nature's Park will be entering its design phase after recent topographical surveying of the area has been completed. Papawick Park has recently received a \$50,000 grant for improvements also. A \$250,000 grant has been awarded for a flood mitigation project managed by Dr. Obropta from Rutgers University to design plans for improved storm water management. This project will help reduce future flood water

This year the drama club will be losing 5 key crucial seniors but the remaining cast is determined to continue the tradition and give fantastical performances. Next year 7 juniors, 11 sophomores, and 5 freshmen are expected to return with plenty of new members. When

talking to the cast they mentioned how all the long hours and practices all paid off after every single performance. While many were nervous as they hadn't performed in a full auditorium in 2 years due to the pandemic, this year they were at full capacity. Raritan Valley's Habitat For Humanity's Critical Home Repair Program

The RVHFH's Critical Home Repair Program addresses significant repairs that affect the health and safety of homeowners. Things like electrical work, furnace replacements, windows, roofing, siding repair, accessibility upgrades, and critical storm repair may qualify.

For these repairs, homeowners contribute a percentage of cost on a sliding scale based on income. That cost can be repaid, interest-free, in regular payments over time (generally 12-24 months).

To qualify for the critical repair program, applicants must have a total household income that does not exceed the following limits:

Household Size	Maximum Income
1 Person	\$75,936
2 People	\$86,784
3 People	\$97,632
4 People	\$108,480
5 People	\$117,158
6 People	\$125,837

If you are approved for the critical home repair program, Raritan Valley Habitat for Humanity will conduct a site assessment and determine when and if our affiliate may have the resources to undertake your project. RV Habitat will then provide an estimate of the total project cost, calculate repayment amount and terms based on the sliding payment scale, and determine sweat equity requirements.

Raritan Valley Habitat for Humanity repair programs are not emergency repair programs. Projects may take several months to be completed, and can take longer to schedule. RV Habitat is a non-profit organization that prioritizes repairs based on urgency, funding, and availability of volunteers and resources.

A Busy and Proud Day For the Manville Police Department

Tuesday, May 24, 2022 was a busy and proud day for the Manville Police Department. The morning began with officers making a trek south to Bell Lab Works in Holmdel. Sergeants David Sheffrin and Nickolas Franzoso graduated from the New Jersey State Association of Chiefs of Police (NJSACOP) Command and Leadership Academy. The officers successfully completed the program in 2020, however due to the COVID-19 pandemic, an in person graduation was not conducted until this year.

This prestigious program began in 1993, when officials from the NJSACOP traveled to the United States Military Academy at West Point to work with the Academy's Department of Behavioral Sciences and Leadership to adapt the fabled West Point model of command and leadership to the needs of law enforcement. The program aims to develop future police leaders who will be equipped to face any policing challenges within their communities. This intensive program requires a 14-week commitment from those selected to participate.

The Manville Police Department congratulates Sgts. Sheffrin and Franzoso on their achievement and is honored to have them as leaders within the agency.

Officers then returned to Manville and attended the swearing in of Sergeant Christopher Morrison. The recent promotional process began in January when Sgt. Bill Yankoski announced that he would be retiring March 1, 2022.

A written exam was administered by the New Jersey State Association of the Chief's of Police. Then two oral interviews were conducted, one by the Somerset County Chiefs of Police Association and a second before the Command Staff of the Manville Police Department. After receiving scores from those three areas, along with information in his personnel file, Sgt. Morrison completed the process with the highest overall score, amongst some very strong competition. I am truly grateful for everyone that participated in this arduous process. It is no easy task and a great deal of time was

spent preparing and studying for each hurdle. I am not sure if his wife, Sara, is appreciative that the process is over or if she would like to have some more free time to herself.

With that being said, I wanted to congratulate Sgt. Morrison and share a bit of his background. Sgt. Morrison grew up in Middlesex, NJ and graduated from Immaculata High School in 2006. He went onto Moravian College, where he earned his Bachelor's Degree in Sociology. While at Moravian, Sgt. Morrison played baseball, was team captain for two years and earned numerous awards. While in college, he completed an internship with the Bethlehem Police Department. In 2010, he was hired by the Manville Police Department as a dispatcher. In 2013, as Manville transitioned to Somerset County dispatch, he was hired as a police officer. Since 2013, he has served in the patrol division. Last year, he was on loan with the Somerset County Prosecutor's Office Organized Crime and Narcotics Task Force. He has served as a departmental field training officer and trained several officers. He just finished training his last new officer earlier this year. As Sgt. Morrison's new assignment, he will be will in charge of a patrol squad. I speak on behalf of the Manville Police Department when I say we all know he will do a fine job in his new assignment. Congratulations again Sgt. Morrison!

shooting fireworks into the air, the rockets often land on neighbor's houses, vehicles, and yards. There is a danger associated with lighting fireworks and the severe injuries they could potentially cause to your body. Additionally, the majority of fireworks in New Jersey are **illegal**. In New Jersey, if you are found in possession of **illegal fireworks, you could be issued a summons and face a \$500 fine, up to 30 days in jail and a criminal record.** Prior to 2017, all fireworks were illegal unless you were at a venue with professional pyrotechnicians. NJ has since legalized some fireworks to be used by homeowners at their residence. These fireworks include hand held or ground based sparklers, snakes, glow worms, smoke worms and smoke bombs. Aerial fireworks and fire crackers are still illegal.

Manville is a small community with houses close together. **Be respectful of your neighbors and aware of the laws.** When the Police Department gets complaints called into our Police Department we will respond and take appropriate action. Please enjoy your 4th of July, but leave the fireworks to the professionals.
