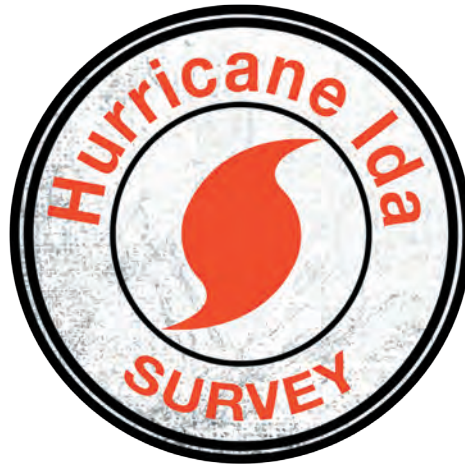

## Manville Urges Residents Impacted by Hurricane Ida to Complete the State’s Survey About Their Assistance Needs

Mayor Onderko is asking all residents to participate in a post-Ida online survey so our community has a strong voice in how millions of dollars in federal aid will be allocated and spent to help make Manville more storm resilient. “*Manville has received 10 million of the 60 million allocated nationwide for the new FEMA Swift Current program. That is a step in the right direction. We need much more federal aid to continue helping residents get out of harm’s way with buyouts and offsetting elevation costs. In addition, mitigation efforts to reduce flood waters produced by the Royce Brook will need funding also. Please take the survey and make your voice heard.*”

**TRENTON, NJ** – The New Jersey Department of Community Affairs’ (DCA) Division of Disaster Recovery and Mitigation is urging New Jersey residents impacted by Hurricane Ida to complete a registration survey about what assistance they need to recover from Ida and better protect their homes and communities from future storms.

The registration survey is posted at <https://www.nj.gov/dca/ddrm/home/idasurvey.shtml> on the DCA website and is available in multiple languages.



“We want to hear from as many people as possible who were affected by Hurricane Ida last September,” said **Lt. Governor Sheila Oliver, who serves as DCA Commissioner.** “Your feedback is invaluable to DCA and will greatly help our efforts to develop assistance and mitigation programs that maximize the federal funds coming to New Jersey for Ida recovery.”

There is no deadline for the registration survey, but DCA is encouraging people to complete it as soon as possible. The Department will use the feedback from the survey to help the State better understand the needs of residents still recovering from Hurricane Ida and to better prepare for future storms and flooding hazards.

The survey data will help guide DCA as it develops a Hurricane Ida Recovery Action Plan for use of \$228 million in federal Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funding that was officially awarded to New Jersey on May 24, 2022. In order to access the CDBG-DR funding, DCA must submit an Action Plan to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) no later than September 28, 2022, for its review and approval.

Also, the survey data will be used to assist the State in dedicating any Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) funding to unmet needs. On May 3, 2022, Governor Murphy announced \$50 million in HMGP funds for Blue Acres buyouts. Additional HMGP funds may be dedicated to other unmet Hurricane Ida recovery and resiliency needs identified through DCA’s survey.

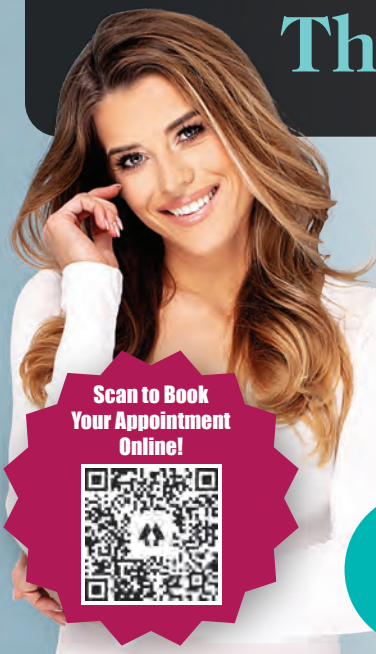

# State's Survey About Hurricane Ida Assistance Needs

By completing the registration survey, New Jersey residents are indicating their interest in learning more about recovery and mitigation programs related to Hurricane Ida. The survey is currently required if people want to apply for future Ida recovery and mitigation programs once they begin.

DCA's Division of Disaster Recovery and Mitigation promotes the long-term resilience of New Jersey's communities by supporting initiatives to fortify housing, businesses, and infrastructure against severe weather events and flooding damage. The Division is also the grant manager for the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund and the Coronavirus Capital Projects Fund, which were allocated to New Jersey through the American Rescue Plan Act to help address the COVID-19 public health emergency and its effects on the economy.

DCA offers a wide range of programs and services, including local government management and finance, affordable housing production, fire safety, building safety, community planning and development, and disaster recovery and mitigation.

## Mayor Onderko's Corner

As the Mayor of the Borough of Manville, I have been very vocal at all levels of our government, the County, State, and Federal levels concerning more aid to Manville after Hurricane Ida hit. Now you can make your voices heard by filling out the survey sponsored by the NJ Department of Community Affairs. The survey link is on our website.

So far \$268 million in federal aid has been allocated to NJ. The results of the survey will help direct the allocation of funds to towns throughout the state. I urge every Manville resident to take the survey. It only takes a few minutes. Please make your voices heard! An overwhelming survey response by those who live here will help keep the spotlight on making Manville storm resilient.

Tax bills for the August 1st payment date have been delayed because we are requesting more state aid to offset the adverse budgetary impacts of Hurricane Ida. Any additional aid received will help offset a property tax increase solely due to the storm's impacts. A full overview of our financials and our new 2022 tax rate will be given next month.

First quarter sewer bills were mailed in May with a due date the end of June. If you did not receive a sewer bill in the mail, you

**2022 Hurricane Preparedness**

Greetings to all Manville Residents, I hope everyone is having an enjoyable summer so far. As we head into New Jersey's tropical storm activity season that is typically between August and October. We ask that all residents prepare in advance.

The "Hurricane Survival Guide for New Jersey" is a helpful guide to give you the information regarding preparations that you should make for Hurricanes and Tropical Storms. The NJ Survival Guide is available by visiting [ready.nj.gov/plan-prepare/hurricanes.shtml](http://ready.nj.gov/plan-prepare/hurricanes.shtml). Resources for individuals with disabilities can be found by visiting [www](http://www.ready.gov/disability).

[ready.gov/disability](http://www.ready.gov/disability). We also ask those residents with pets to visit [www.animalemergency.nj.gov](http://www.animalemergency.nj.gov) for helpful information regarding pet preparedness for emergencies.

Manville OEM has multiple alerting systems and a social media page that we make available to residents to get up to date information. Manville Borough OEM can be found on Facebook. Nixle messages from Manville Police and OEM can be received via text or email and you can register for Nixle messages at [www.nixle.com](http://www.nixle.com). Code Red is our phone messaging system that we send out alerts to residents for all weather emergencies and other important information regarding things going on in the Borough. You can register for Code Red by visiting [www.ManvilleNJ.org](http://www.ManvilleNJ.org) and go to the list of Helpful Links that is in the home page. And coming soon we will have a MyManville GoGov app that will be

available for download on the Android or Apple App Store.

Lastly, I would also like to remind residents that our Emergency Siren System is tested on the first Saturday of every month at 12:00 pm. During actual emergencies when the siren system is activated we ask that residents monitor the alerting systems previously mentioned. These messages will give evacuation information, shelter information and areas where residents can move vehicles to in the event of flooding or other weather emergencies. The vacant, fenced property behind Manville Pizza which borders East Camplain Road will be made available for residents to park their vehicles.

In closing, I would like to thank all of our residents for their continued support.

# Home Elevations Underway to Improve Storm Resiliency

**A townhall information session will be held some time in August**

A second home elevation is underway in the Lost Valley section of town. An all-brick ranch style home has been successfully elevated to be well above the base flood elevation of that location. The longtime homeowner did not want to take a buyout since the home has been in the family for many years.

The lift system used is electric and not hydraulic. It is considered a fail-safe lift system. The basement was recently filled to grade, and masonry work will be underway to set the home back down on a new foundation with flow-through flood vents installed. Some of the benefits of home elevations are to have the homeowners flood insurance premiums reduced significantly and to avoid first floor damages in major floods.

Governor Murphy's office will be announcing an elevation funding program later this summer. If you have an NFIP flood insurance policy, you can receive \$30,000 to help fund the elevation under FEMA's increased cost of compliance if your home was substantially damaged by Hurricane Ida. The State's elevation program will hopefully fund the remainder of the costs to successfully elevate. On average, elevation costs are between \$75,000 - \$100,000 and can be completed within a 30-day timeframe. Any homeowners interested in an elevation should plan on attending the town hall being planned for August.



- Home is elevated to base flood elevation (BFE) + 3 feet
- Basement is filled in to grade
- All utilities will be placed above the BFE
- Flood insurance premiums are reduced

### Main Street Pedestrian Safety Road Diet Update

Somerset County Engineering has informed the Borough the project will be going out to bid this fall with construction most likely beginning in the spring of 2023. The vehicle-merge by the Police Station and underpass will occur entering town at Dukes Parkway once construction begins.

All pedestrian cross walks and traffic signals will be enhanced to improve safety for those who travel and walk our Main Street. This is a federally funded project through the New Jersey Transportation Planning Authority (NJPTA).


